Signage along scenic byways: NYSDOT 23 USC 131(s) addresses outdoor advertising control, particularly along scenic byways. New signs allowed under Section 131 (s) include directional and official signs, notices, sale or lease signs and on-property signs. No new off-premise advertising signs will be allowed (Shirley Egan). Shirley gave the board several approaches to handle off-premise, permanent advertising signs along scenic byways. Board will study this and discuss it at next meeting.
